


### OPEN AIR THEATRE

#### **TEACHER'S WORKSHOP**

Phonics and Spelling become Fun and Easy through Jolly Phonics

Primary Department teachers along with Mrs. S Singhal and Mrs. S Ray from the Junior Department attended the Jolly Phonics workshop in school on Saturday, 6th May 2017. This brilliant day long workshop was conducted by Ms. Shainaz Jussa, Director, Phonickids and Facilitator of Jolly Phonics. A technique taught to the children in gradual progression helps them blend sounds together to say ('synthesize') a word. They also learn how to use the letter sounds to read and write words. Through this method, a wide range of spelling concepts and patterns are taught, enabling children to extend their knowledge in order to spell words accurately.



#### **SUPERBRAIN YOGA**



We had a wonderful session of 'Superbrain Yoga', conducted by a parent Mr.N Bihani, father of Hredaan Bihani of Upper Nursery B.
