CIS FRENCH DEPARTMENT JUNIOR SCHOOL COMMEMORATES LE QUATORZE JUILLET

The students of Class 5, on behalf of the French Department of the Junior School of CIS, recreated and presented the scene of one of the most significant events in the annals of France, The Storming of the Bastille, when they got together to celebrate the National Day of France in school in a special assembly.





The young actors of class 5 showed clearly through actions and words in the skit scripted by them, how the revolutionaries broke into the prison in Paris on the 14th of July,1789. The audience understood how the fall of Bastille was the flashpoint of the French Revolution which led to the fall of the monarchy and the formation of the French Republic.

The skit was followed by a power point presentation of the Bastille Day celebration in France. The audience thoroughly enjoyed watching the videos on the military parade at Champs – Élysées , the air displays by the French Air force and the mesmerizing fireworks display at the Eiffel Tower in the evening.

Teachers attend workshop on initiating dialogue on gender equality in schools

On Tuesday, the 24th of July, Mrs Nayar, Dr Munmun Nath, Mrs Neelam Choudhary, Mrs Rina Mitra, Ms Didhiti Ghosh, Mrs Chayita Sen, Mrs Sushmita Ray, Mrs Sujata Ahuja, Mrs Farishta Dastur Mukherjee and Ms Kashmiri Marwah attended a workshop on gender equality in schools, in all its different perspectives.

The workshop, held at Frank Anthony Public School, was an initiative of Teachers Centre, Loreto House. It was conducted by Dr Ranjita Biswas, Consultant Psychiatrist and Executive Member of Sappho for Equality. In the workshop, there were audio visual presentations and explanations on gender non conforming persons and these were highly enlightening.

Sappho for Equality is an organization which was founded in 2003 to work for the rights of persons with non normative gender sexual identities and expressions. Some recent researches conducted by Sappho and other organizations had shown that in schools, which were primary agencies of education and socialisation, children who did not conform to gender stereotypes faced discrimination affecting their lives to a great extent.

Therefore, in the workshop, teachers were sensitized about such children and made aware of the difficulties faced by them. They were reminded of the important role they could play in removing prejudice against them, promoting their well being and education in school, promoting positive interaction between these children, their peers, engaging and communicating with their parents and in protecting their rights to lead dignified lives in schools and even beyond.
