The celebration came to an end with everybody singing the national anthem.




## ICT FEST


#### **'FIRST TIME IN CIS'**



Students of class 1 to 5 spent the entire morning of 10th May 2018 experiencing the digital world. The first ever ICT Festival of the Junior Department showcased the talent and knowledge the students have acquired in all these years. The delightful display of students' work using different computer applications mesmerised one and all. The highlight of the displays was the collaborative study with other subjects. Students incorporated their lessons of English, Math, Science, History and Art through digital representation.











The morning assembly was a good start to the day, with a brainstorming quiz session and drama, educating students on how to be safe on the digital platform. They spoke on being 'SMART' while using the Internet. The teachers focussed on the online survey conducted in school to show the behaviour of students in the virtual world.

It was informative and educational.







Students of all classes in the Junior School played games in the ICT Lab. These interesting and enjoyable games were created by the students of Grade 5 using PowerPoint.

Mrs Dubey, ICT teacher of Senior School was proud of the students' achievements but also said 'Technology should be used more as a tool than as a toy'.

Mrs. Nayar and Mrs. Choudhary appreciated and encouraged the initiative undertaken by the teachers of the ICT Department and applauded the students for their hard work.





After a workshop with parents on 'Parenting in the age of Social Media' by the school counsellor, the ICT Department of Junior School conducted an online survey on students about their use of gadgets, online activities and exposure to social media.

The data received was analysed by the ICT teachers, which helped us to understand students' interest in ICT and other related activities. This will enable us to guide the young minds on how to use technology positively, make them aware of the uses and risks of the Internet and teach them how to be safe online in the years to come. It will also help the school frame guidelines to be followed.

#### **Key Pointers from the Survey:**

- The survey indicates that most children are aware of safety risks while working online. A certain percentage of students need more attention and guidance regarding internet safety. These lessons are ongoing and will be a part of the curriculum.
- It has been understood from the survey that some students have their own **mobile phones and email ids**. Students must be careful while using them. Parents should be aware of the passwords to make sure that their children are protected online. The child's online activity should be monitored and made secure.
- Adult Supervision: The survey shows, students across Grades 2 to 5 use the internet for research, online games and watching / downloading videos. It is advisable that parents are aware of their child's online activities and the sites they are visiting. As most of such online activities happen outside school, it is important that parents speak to their children regarding downloading videos and clicking on unknown links. The survey also tells us that there is a percentage of students using the Social Media as well as the webcam. We do hope that parents are aware of and monitor their child's connections on such platforms.

### ICT Survey Analysis



#### More Highlights from the Survey:

- Students enjoy the ICT lessons at school. They like going to the ICT Lab for their practical lessons.
- Students like learning and working on the various applications being taught in school – MS Paint, MS Word, MS Excel and MS PowerPoint. They particularly enjoy creating designs and presentations on Paint and PowerPoint.
- The survey also tells us that students appreciate the facilities provided in the ICT Lab with a special emphasis on lab cleanliness. However, the suggestions regarding some infrastructure will definitely be looked into and taken care of.

#### Advice:

 Students should restrict their online activity to within an hour unless it is research oriented and well supervised.

#### **ISBF and LSE Annual Teacher's Symposium 2018**

Mrs. Nayar, Mrs. Choudhary and Mrs. Majumdar attended the Indian School of Business and Finance (ISBF) and London School of Economics (LSE) Annual Teacher's Symposium 2018 on Tuesday, 3<sup>rd</sup> April 2018 at Radisson Kolkata. The welcome address delivered by Dr. G. L. Tayal, Dean, ISBF stressed on the need for educators to adapt the teaching learning process to suit the needs of the new age learner-the "Millennials".

Dr. James Abdey, Lecturer in Statistics, LSE in his keynote address, spoke on the topic-'Are Classrooms irrelevant?' He pointed out that classrooms will continue to hold relevance. However, they will have to involve technology to appeal and engage the new millennium learners.

Ms. Susmita Bhattacharya, Ward Councillor, TMC, Park Street suggested ways to bridge the generation gap between the educators and the young learners. The breakaway session conducted by Dr. Tayal and Father Benny Thomas, Principal St. Xaviers shared strategies to create environments to enable the millennials and their teachers to unleash their potential.

The symposium concluded with an insight into ISBF'S pedagogical interventions towards inculcating and fostering a spirit of enquiry by Mr. Aryapriya Ganguly, Associate Professor ISBF. The Teacher's Symposium thus provided a good platform to reflect on ways to improve the teaching learning process, which we at CIS constantly strive towards.

Mrs. Tania M Roy attended a two day workshop on Active Learning and Assessment for Learning - Humanities and Social Sciences Professional Development training in Chennai on the  $6^{\rm th}$  and  $7^{\rm th}$  of April. 
