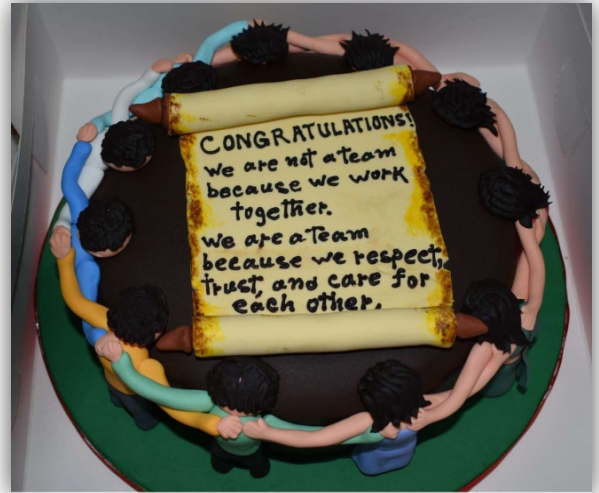

The pupils of Upper Nursery B dressed in the colours of the Indian Flag, confidently sang "We shall overcome" in Hindi, English and Bengali.



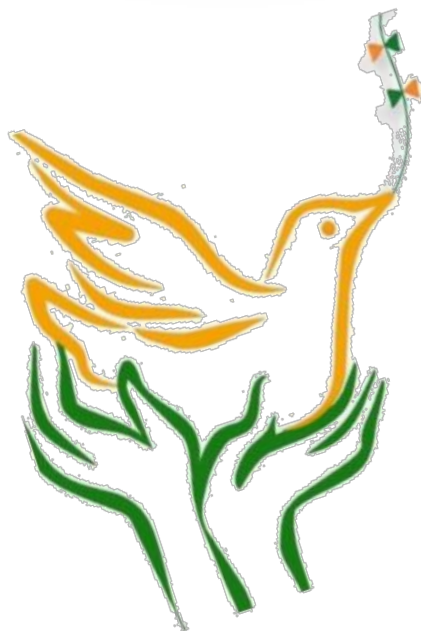

The theme chosen by Class 2 was 'Hamara Hindustan'.

The young ones told the audience how our country got its name and what it means. Through mesmerizing, vivid visuals, the audience were taken on an amazing journey across India showing what makes India unique.





Freedom is dear to every living being, be it a bird or us, humans. Class 3 conveyed this message through their enactment of a short skit called 'Liberté' along with visuals of the great freedom fighters and martyrs of India. The children kindled the patriotic feeling with the song 'Ae Watan', while some of them danced gracefully to it.



The young learners of Class 4 traced India's economic growth in pre and post - independence days. It was followed by a skit on the native Indian businessmen who were determined to make India economically self-reliant even before 1947, despite British resistance.





Class 5 presented a docu-theatre – ‘The First Step’ based on the life and works of the great Bengali educationist, scholar and social reformer - Ishwar Chandra Vidyasagar. The play highlighted his enormous contribution towards women’s education during the 19th century and how it benefitted the later generations.



The young children of the Hope Foundation danced to the song “Saare Jahan Se Accha”. It was a delightful performance!

The children said they were very happy to see so many bright colours and learnt a lot about Indian history through the performances of CIS students.

Mrs. Chitra Roy gave the students a first-hand insight into the life and struggle of an Indian soldier on the 7th and 8th of August 2018. The children were captivated by a video on first person accounts of Indian soldiers - on what motivates them and what inspires them to lay down their lives for the sake of the nation.



The students were then taken on an overwhelming journey of visuals on the Kargil Conflict which finally culminated in the story of two brave sons of India, Capt Vikram Batra and Colonel Sonam Wangchuk.

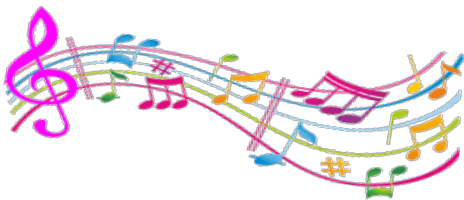

Flamenco Workshop

Maria Sanchez Sanz, a dance teacher, choreographer and a fusion dance performer from Segovia, conducted a three hour long dance workshop for the pupils of Classes 4 and 5 on the 20th of August at the AVR. In this workshop, she introduced the children to a genre of dance and music, a little apart from what the pupils are familiar with.



Spectacular in her red and black attire, Ms. Sanz showed the pupils how the Oriental and Arabic flamenco is performed, step by step and galvanized the pupils into action by making them go through all these steps group by group. She taught the pupils also how to punctuate these



graceful movements with rhythmic hand claps typical of this popular dance form from Andalusia, Spain. She gave them a background of this dance form, stimulating their evident interest further. Ms. Sanchez Sanz made the workshop wonderfully interesting by connecting herself so well with the children.



The children of Classes 1 to 3 joined the workshop to witness the final production and took part in the interactive session.



Also present at the workshop was Dr. Jorge Diego Sanchez, a professor at Salamanca University in Spain and Mrs. Sohini Roychowdhury.



Mrs. Roychowdhury, a renowned Bharatanatyam exponent, addressed the children and said that the mission of her organization, 'Sohinimoksha' was to connect civilizations and teach young pupils the value of love and peace through the medium of music and dance.

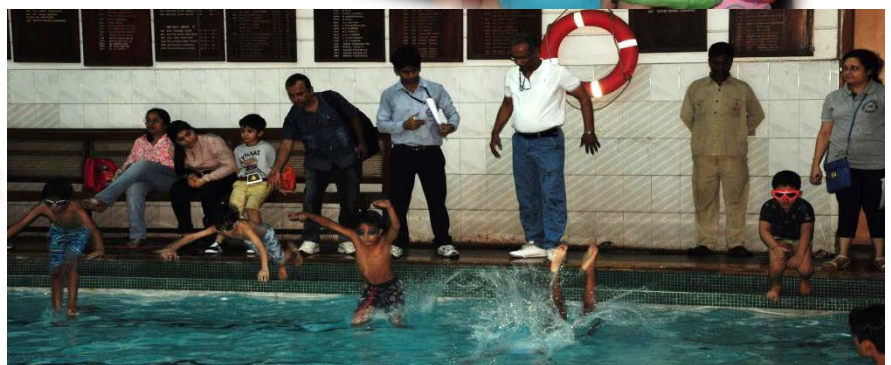
ANNUAL SWIMMING MEET

Shivika Johri of Class 4 and Samarth Vir Singh of Class 5 were the Individual champions of Group D (Classes 4 to 5) with the highest points.

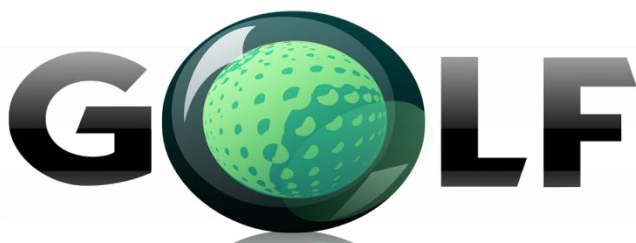


Green House emerged as the winner of the Annual Swimming Meet, 2018 with 267 points.

**A Culture of Complaint or a
Culture of Gratitude?**

Look Teacher, this student doesn't know how to talk politely'

'I am fed up of the traffic in this city! I wish I could live somewhere else!'

Let us take a moment to think about what Robert Hughes calls the 'Culture of Complaint'.

Participating in such talk is easy because there is apparently a lot of "wrong" around us, but this kind of dialogue is destructive and often spreads quickly. Stuck in a rut of complaining, we often hold the belief that we don't need to change anything about ourselves. Worse, we remain stuck and spread our toxic attitude to others, sapping our motivation to change and making the problems seem even more difficult than they are.

Gratitude is the best way to look at the different perspective and with a attitude. We may ask ourselves: inculcate this attitude in our

Know your facts:

- ***Ishwar Chandra Vidyasagar*** encouraged ***John Elliot Drinkwater Bethune*** to establish the first school for girls in Kolkata in 1849. They were both pioneers in women's education. It was founded as a secular 'Native Female School' (for secular education of girls) in 1849 by John Elliot Drinkwater Bethune. The Government took it over in 1856, renaming it Bethune School after its founder in 1862–63. In 1879 it developed into Bethune College, the first women's college in India.
- In 1878, a student of Bethune School, Kadambani Ganguly was the first candidate to write the entrance examination of the University of Calcutta.
- Kadambini Ganguly and Chandramukhi Basu were the first female graduates from CU in 1883.
- Kadambini Ganguly was the first lady student to join Calcutta Medical College and became the first practising lady doctor in India. Chandramukhi Basu joined Bethune College as a lecturer in English and later became the first Lady Principal of the institution.
- ***Ishwar Chandra Vidyasagar*** included English and Bengali as the medium of learning besides Sanskrit.
- He allowed non-Brahmin students to get enrolment in Sanskrit College.
- He opened 35 schools for women all over Bengal and was successful in enrolling 1300 female students.
- He initiated 'Nari Siksha Vandar', a fund to support women education in Bengal.
- ***Ishwar Chandra Vidyasagar*** wrote 'Borno Porichoy', an elementary level book for learning the Bengali letters of the alphabet where he reconstructed the alphabet and reformed it into typography of 12 vowels and 40 consonants. Vidyasagar's lasting legacy 'Borno Porichoy', is vastly used even today.
