
From across the seven seas...

Harvard Model Congress Asia MUN 2015



Teacher's Chef India



My participation in the IIHM Teachers chef India (Eastern Region) 2014 competition was a culmination of the combined efforts of Piyali Ray (co-competitor and last year's finalist) persistence and my own passion for cooking.

For the preliminary round which was on a working day, the 9th of January I chose to make a Smoked Chicken Tart which was well appreciated by the judges. I found myself short-listed for the semi-finals along with 5 other teachers' from C.I.S.

The excitement was infectious, with Mrs. Shetty and Ms. Ray, discussing strategies at every given opportunity since the countdown to the 23rd of January had begun. The competition was on Friday, which was also a public holiday and the participants had to arrive bright and early at the IIHM premises. We were greeted with coffee and sandwiches. Participants (Teachers) from other schools in the Eastern region were also present. Altogether there were around 50 participants.

We were escorted to our respective work stations (kitchens) and the IIHM chef gave us a short briefing on what was expected from us. We were given 1 hour and had to cook one dish. Then began an hour of what I call 'Fun'. I had not expected to enjoy cooking under pressure in an unfamiliar environment. I decided to make a Cottage Cheese and Chicken Stuffed Ravioli in a herb, tomato and cream sauce served with a burnt butter garlic sauce. I had never made ravioli before, so it was quite risky but I was pleased by its look and taste once I had made it. To my surprise so did the 5 judges and my dish got me into the finals. The next stage became very interesting as Mrs. Shetty was one of my opponents. I was to have a friendly face off against 12 teachers. For the finals we had to make 3 dishes in less than 2 hours.

The dishes would consist of a starter, main course and a dessert. I did know what to make as the ingredients were limited. Since I had some lemon and chilies, I decided to make them my core flavor and create dishes around them. I settled on making Chicken Roulade with Thai spices (using coconut milk, lime, coriander and chilies). Once that was done, I started to make the dessert. I decided it would be a deconstructed apple tart served with biscuits. As for the starter, I made sesame encrusted prawn served with a chilli lime sauce. All my dishes looked amazing and tasted just as good. I was proud of what I had made. Although I was exhausted, when I was declared the winner by the judges I suddenly felt elated. I won a holiday in Goa and I am looking forward to it. My overall experience in the IIHM cooking competition was amazing and I am looking forward to participate once again. I am proud that I have brought glory to my own name as well as the school's.
