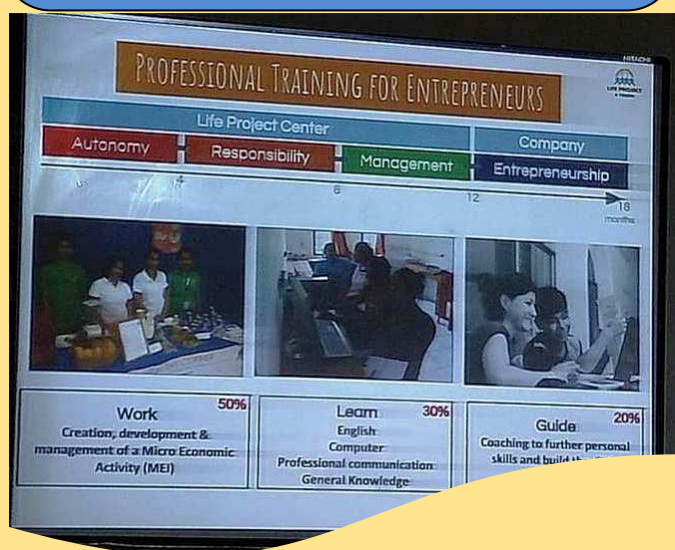

In school IB workshop - 'Approaches to Teaching and Learning' in DP

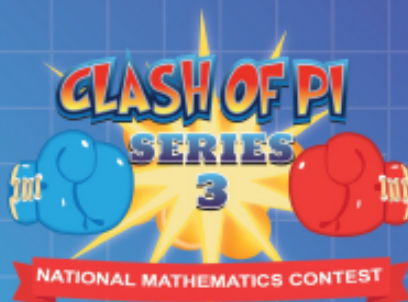
On 3rd and 4th August 2018, IB@CIS organised the ATL workshop attended by 25 Senior School IB Teachers.

1st Runner up was Modern High School and 2nd Runner up was St. Xavier's Collegiate School.

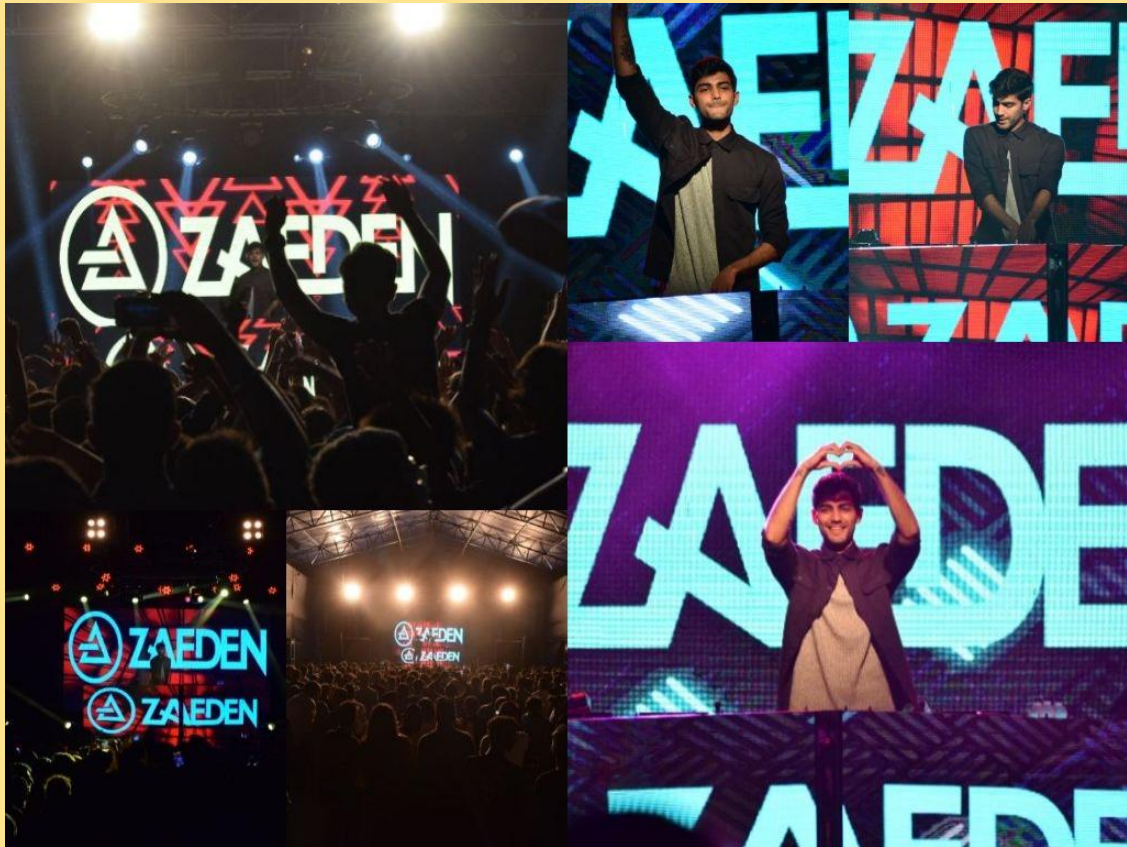
