

End of Year workshops in Middle school for Holistic Development of students

Public Speaking sessions were conducted by **Mr. Errol O'Brien** for classes 6 and 7 on 4th 7th and 8th May, 2018. Each session was for an hour a day for every section. He helped students to build confidence, enunciation and the use of correct play of word to capture the attention of the listener through Public Speaking. Students had an amazing educational experience with Mr. O'Brien in this short span of time.





Grade 8 was introduced to an art workshop on 'pattachitra', an art form from rural India. It was conducted by traditional pattachitra artists. Pattachitra is a cloth based scroll painting which depicts scenes from a story while the artists narrates in the form of a song. The class was completely entranced by a demonstration of the excerpts from the Mahabharata. The students learnt to make colours from natural products. They gradually painted an image of the Hindu God Shiva and a maiden pouring water over his head with the background of a garden with coconut trees with these natural colours.
