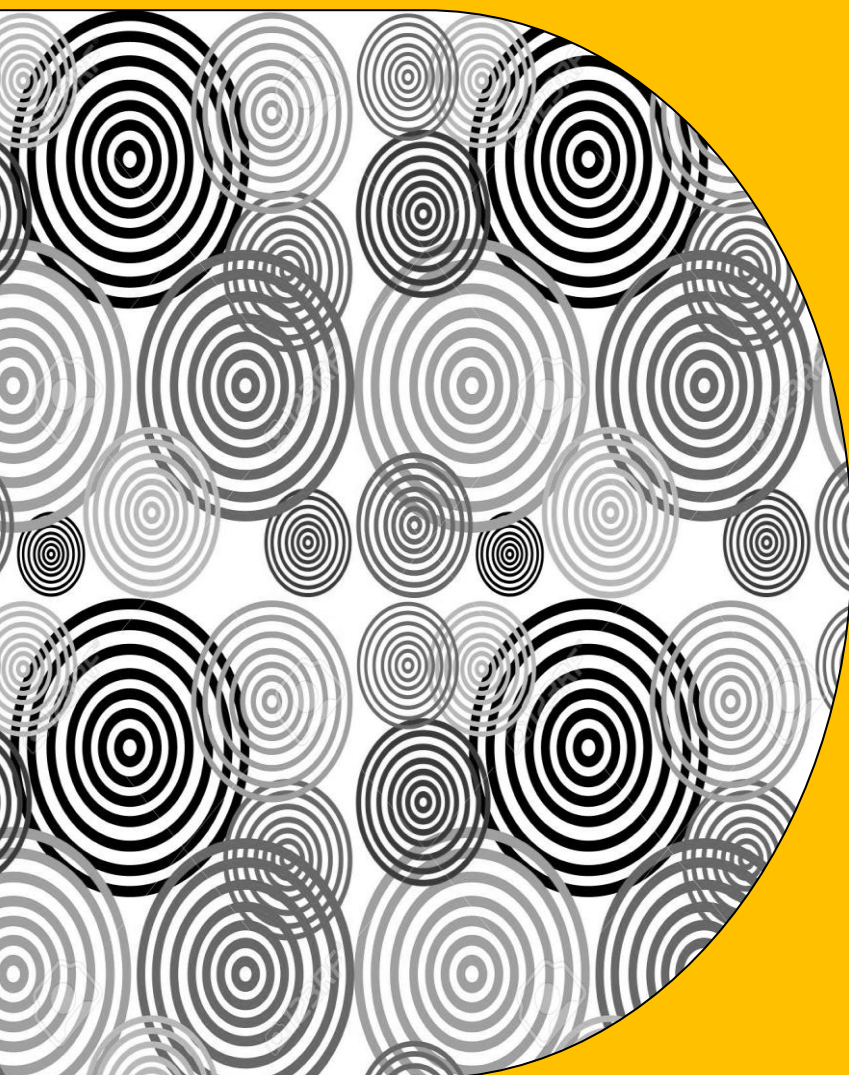

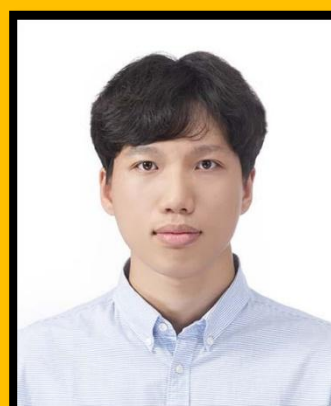
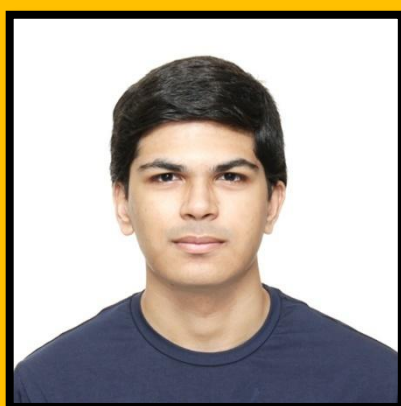

University Visits for AS, A Level, IBDP-1 and IBDP-2



A total of 61 universities visited the CIS campus to apprise the students from AS, A Level, IBDP₁ and IBDP₂ about their respective admission procedure and the courses available in each of them. 45 universities from the United States of America, 6 from the United Kingdom, 3 each from Australia and Canada and 1 each from UAE, Italy, Switzerland and Germany visited our campus. Among the noted Universities were King's College and York University from the United Kingdom, University of California from the USA, Monash University from Australia.

Spell Bee – Middle Section
