The new Learning Management System (LMS): E-Learning at CIS was implemented in this academic session for a more streamlined and organised teaching and learning process.

Learning Management System (LMS) is a software application for administration, documentation, tracking, reporting and delivery of Educational Information

Taking into account the current scenario where we are unable to meet our students physically, CIS decided to incorporate an LMS for continuing the teaching- learning process comfortably.


CIS prides itself as one of the few schools in the city which has implemented an LMS in their school system for keeping all aspects of teaching learning under one umbrella. An LMS also takes into consideration the security of our students while in an online setting. Access through a single login generated by the LMS, ensures that only the students and teachers enrolled in the platform are able to use it. This ensures that data of students or teachers is not mishandled by anyone out of our school system. The possibility of any outsider entering the system is nil, therefore enabling the students and the teachers to optimise the time and keep the learning process safe and smooth.

To add to its features, there is transparency in the log in time stamps of all students and teachers of all classes.

Teachers attended multiple training sessions in order to understand the system such that they were ready before the school reopened.

For the future, we are looking at the possibility of bringing assessment through the LMS.






Grade 6B students made Business Cards using a template as a part of Interview Skills and Communication Skills under the supervision of their English teacher Ms Upasana Saraswati


VIRTUAL ORIENTATION TO THE NEW SESSION

Apart from attending various webinars, the teachers also shared their teaching practices with their colleagues and thereby enabling them to learn about various tools and platforms that ensure engagement of the students and effective learning in on-line classes.

Biology teacher, Mrs Debleena Gupta conducted a session on Inquiry-Based learning where she mapped the Cambridge Teaching beliefs and structures in the 5E Teaching framework and also shared how, in the new situation, we can have more engaging and meaningful learning activities designed for the learners.

English teacher, Mr Surya Subha Banerjee conducted a session on Assessment for Learning (AFL) where he shared the various methods of incorporating AFL in a lesson and also guided the teachers through the process of designing effective rubrics for various assessments.
