
organized a virtual carnival on May 30 and May 31 to raise funds.

She added that the activities will be followed by an online music concert by students. Sarda urged people from all over to participate and donate. Till date, they have managed to collect one lakh rupees. The funds raised will be donated

to Rangeen Khidki Foundation which is working on the menstrual health of wom-

en affected by Amphan and Rebuild Bengal Campaign by Switch ON Foundation which aims to help the cyclone victims in affected areas. Vinay Jaju, co-founder of Switch ON Foundation said that the funds raised by the unique initiative of virtual carnival will be donated to our campaign and it will be utilised in a fruitful way by helping people of Bengal, severely affected by Cyclone Amphan.


2. AVOID GOING OUT OF YOUR HOUSE Especially to crowded places like malls, Playgrounds, restaurants and classes.


