



Finally, a day filled with fun and boundless love came to an end with the entire Junior Section dancing to the “HAPPY SONG”.




The students of Grades 1 to 5 had a special Children’s Day session with their Class teachers in the morning of 12th November 2020.

Ms. Dupratt and Ms. Mukherjee shared a short poem and card designed for the children of 1A and 1B and the students watched a short animated movie.




Grade 2 children dressed up in beautiful attires shared their happy thoughts on the mentimeter. They excitedly looked forward to the events of the day.



Bengali


The young learners of **Grade 1** gradually gaining confidence with their letter sound association, alongside enriching their vocabulary and their creativity.

Students of **Grade 2**, excited about their evening snacks, work on a project and share simple snack recipes in class with their friends.





Knowledge Sharing and Teachers' Training
