


Pre Nursery A



The week was concluded with the learners drawing beautiful illustrations of their favourite story by Jan Brett.














Nursery B






JUNIOR SCHOOL MATH & SCIENCE QUIZ

A Virtual Math-Science Quiz was held on Friday, the 19th of February, which was well attended by pupils and Faculty of the Junior School, as well as by the Heads of Departments of both subjects from the Senior School. 4 Pupils from each House, from Grades 4 and 5 combined, formed a team with 3 teams in total in this closely contested House Competition between the 3 Houses – Red, Green and Yellow.

The team members from Red House were – Agastya Chanda and Ashwin Chowdhury from Grade 4 and Neil Gutgutia and Karan Jhunjhunwala from Grade 5. Yellow House was represented by Vivaan Siotia, Tanay Rampuria from Grade 4, Rajanya Deb and Srijan Saha from Grade 5. From Green House, the quizzers were Veer Poddar and Zoya Azim from Grade 4 and Ebrahin Hasnain and Dibyesh Sanyal from Grade 5.

The Quiz Masters, the Math and Science teachers of the Junior School, namely Mrs. Sujata Ahuja, Mrs. Antara Banerjee, Mrs. Ananya Bhattacharya, Mrs. Sreeparna Mukherjee had conceptualized the virtual quiz.



The quiz was held in a number of time bound, grippingly exciting and varied rounds with interesting questions that were linked to the school curriculum and these tested the extent to which students could apply their knowledge and skills to real-life situations. These began with a round of general questions from each subject through a PPT with wonderful animation side by side. This was followed by a Rapid Fire round which tested the tenacity, and presence of mind of the intrepid participants, along with their knowledge, on the spot calculation powers, memory, logic and application skills.



The Activity Round was held in Breakout Rooms, while the rest of the audience were shown a PPT on a great Mathematician, Leonardo Fabionacci, during this period.






The most exciting part was when the results were announced. Red House won, followed by Green and then Yellow House.

Workshop by the SEN department




The SEN department conducted a sensitization programme for mainstream teachers of Junior School - "Learning Style - Creating an engaging environment" on 8th February, 2021. The programme was planned as part of the continuous training from SEN dept to mainstream teachers. Rationale behind this programme was to help the teachers to understand the individual differences in their students' learning styles, so that they can implement best practice strategies in their classrooms. A video was shared highlighting the importance of individualized learning style. Later, teachers were asked to answer a questionnaire based on the learning style. This activity helped teachers to identify their own learning style. After that, through a PPT, the strengths of each learning style and strategies to teach students under each learning style (Visual, Auditory, Kinesthetic and Tactile) were discussed. The SEN Educators, Mrs. Sinha Mitra, Ms. Debnath, Mrs. Ali and Mrs. Sarkar cleared teachers' doubts through a question answer session. At the end, teachers had to fill in a google form as an exit ticket. The program was interactive and the teaching strategies shared by the SEN department for diverse learners is surely going to be useful.



Counselling Session

The students of grade 4 attended a session on "Communication with Empathy" with the school counsellors (4A on 5th February and 4B on 12th February, 2021). The interactive session enabled the children to brainstorm and discuss the various aspects of communication such as eye contact, tone of voice, waiting for one's turn to ask questions, using gestures and many more. The importance of non verbal communication was explained, with a special emphasis on Listening skills. Children were given an insight into how Active Listening can enhance communication with others.



Communication skills are a crucial aspect of interpersonal relationships. For communication to be effective, we must work on being receptive to others, as much as we need to focus on self expression. To sensitize Grade 2 students on the topic, the school counsellors held life skill sessions on 19th and 26th February, 2021. The interactive sessions emphasized the importance of Non-Verbal Communication and how it impacts our interpersonal interaction. Various aspects of communication were addressed and explained - such as listening, eye contact, use of gestures, paying adequate attention to the speaker, reflecting, waiting for one's turn to speak, to name a few. The session aimed at enabling students to be effective and holistic communicators.




