
Essay Competition 2021




The Queen's Commonwealth Essay Competition is conducted as a platform for students to express their ideas through writing and harnessing the power of a youth's voice in their immediate and global community.

On 27th September, IBDP Year 1 students collaborated with Middle Section students to observe World Mental Health Day.

School Counsellor, Ms Spriha Patronobis and Middle Section Head, Mr Surya Subha Banerjee had a few planning sessions with the students from IBDP Year 1 where they appraised the students about the issues that could be addressed in Middle Section. The theme for this year was power dynamics and mental health. As such, IBDP Year 1 students were divided into 3 teams, one for each grade in Middle School. 


CIS Shines

Students Organise


Fund Raiser




Practices in Grade 8:


English Literature and Civics

Under the guidance of Ms. Arpita Gomes, students of Grade 8 studied the Civics topic 'How India is governed?' in a unique manner. Students were engaged in learning about the election process of India through a mock election which was conducted in the course of the class.


Students had to create two to three political parties, and create their own logo, a name for the party and aims and objectives for their party. The parties delivered presentations in group, answered questions from peers and finally a mock election was conducted over zoom polling and the leader of the winning party became the mock Prime minister.

This activity offered a clear idea to students about how the parties are formed, how the elections are held, what is the election commission and how it works. It also gave them a thorough idea about the current affairs of the country (such as gender issues, need for socioeconomic and political development, waste management and welfare works) when the parties had framed their aims and objectives or agendas for ruling the country. The innovative teaching strategy also helped bring real life situations come alive in the classroom creatively and enabled the students to develop critical thinking skills.











In their English Literature lessons with Ms. Sreeja Kundu, grade 8 students were introduced to the concept of drama by writing short scripts of certain situations and enactment of the same (based on prompts provided in class). This was followed by analysis of 'Script to Screen' videos to contextualise drama as a piece of performance. The students then conducted research on the basic societal structure of the Shakespearean era and presented their findings in class.
