Earth Day

The Primary Section celebrated Earth Day on April 22nd, 2022 and the week 18th to 22nd April as the Earth week.

On 22nd of April, students of Grade 5 visited the Primary section and shared information on how to 'Invest in our Planet' through PowerPoint presentations and activities. The student driven initiative was engaging. To celebrate the day, students and teachers were dressed up in hues of blue and green.

Grade Pre-Nursery A

The students of Grade Pre Nursery A drew a picture and made a chip-paper collage of the Earth with colourful hand impressions. They watched how paper and plastic are recycled to make something new. Plastic bottles and toilet paper rolls were reused to paint and make planters and pen stands respectively.

Grade Nursery - Students of Grade 5 explained why it is important to save the environment.




Grade Upper Nursery - Students of Grade 5 explained the importance of food as a resource and to save resources.

Math English Subject Collaboration by Grade 5 for Earth Day

“ They went, they surveyed, they concluded”.

All the students, each without exception, held interviews with other students/their peers conducted surveys, deduced, inferred, drew conclusions, and explained how their lifestyles impacted the environment because of their food habits and preferences, high use as well as wastage of electricity, their preferred way / daily mode of travel to school and back , amongst other things.



The Grade 5s interviewed pupils across Grades 1-4, (including their own peers in Grade 5), collected authentic data and used this to draw graphs to clearly represent their findings and to show these consumption patterns visually.

The information and data collected was further analyzed from Earth day.org. studies and calculations and represented in tabular form.

The final evaluation of how their individual choices and preferences resulted in high carbon dioxide emissions was also explained clearly in paragraphs written by them . The impact of this lifestyle and food consumption patterns on the environment was visible.

As a result of this, students thought of ways of changing their lifestyles in order to try to reduce carbon emissions and global warming.

They shared their ideas and displayed their graphs and conclusions.






Global Citizenship

LIFE SKILLS

With our senior most batch of the Junior section, Grade 5, rapidly approaching adolescence, a conversation on ‘Understanding Puberty’ was the need of the hour for the students, before they transitioned into middle school. The school counsellors, Mrs. Spriha Patronobis and Mrs.

Farishta Dastur Mukerji conducted awareness sessions for students to understand the physiological and emotional changes that they were expected to undergo and ways to be equipped for this dynamic phase of human development. The sessions were conducted separately for boys and girls so that each cohort was homogenous – which created an atmosphere of comfort to enable candid conversations. Children found the interactive sessions extremely beneficial as it provided them the correct platform to overcome their inhibitions on the topic and clear all their doubts, to gain accurate information in an age appropriate manner.



The students of Grade 4 attended a session with Mrs. Farishta Dastur Mukerji, School Counsellor. The focus of the session was to create a space where students could share their feelings and thoughts about the experiences they had during the pandemic. The 'safe space' gave the students an opportunity to vent the same in a fruitful manner. While it is important to acknowledge the negative feelings, it is equally important for students to be thankful and begin thinking about gratitude. An activity was conducted where they were asked to write a letter to any person who they have been grateful for, in the last 2 years. The students were encouraged to physically hand over or post the letter to the person they had identified. The session was very fruitful, as it generated insight while allowing the students some time to reflect on their own experiences.







The workshop focussed on the importance of project based learning in Mathematics. The facilitator emphasised how through projects teachers can enhance critical thinking skills among students and how an abstract concept can develop into the main mathematical idea proceeding from the ‘Known to the Unknown’.

This was followed by a Pictograph activity where the concept of Estimation was included.

The final concept done was of ‘Tessellation’ and how through a simple activity the progress of the Project could be evaluated. The takeaways from the workshop were to keep the activity simple, be prepared and the last being of utmost importance- to encourage the learners to think ‘out of the box’.

Math Sharing Session


On 10th May, 2022 the Math Department of Junior School had a sharing session by Mrs. Kirti Gandhi, who completed her Extension Cambridge Primary Mathematics course conducted by Cambridge Assessment International Education. The session stressed on the following points:

- Curriculum Challenges
- Assessing student progress
- Understanding the marking principles and assessment structure.
- Using formative feedback to support student progress.

She shared about the changes in the new curriculum with respect to various topics and sub-topics.

She also explained the different criteria to keep in mind while checking the Progression and Checkpoint papers and ways of assessing the learners. She showed the teachers present how detailed feedback could be given to support and motivate learners while they solved their problems. Overall, it was an enriching and productive session.

Another sharing session on Project Based Learning was conducted on the same day. Mrs I. Mokha, Mrs R. Dhanuka, Mrs N. Dixit and Mrs A. Banerjee shared their experience of the workshop they had attended. They emphasised that the approach of projects should be such that the objective is simple and can be collaborated with other subjects.



Mrs Khaitan and Ms Bhansali shared their feedback on the Phonics and Storytelling workshop with the teachers of the English Department on May 5th, 2022.

Breakfast Meets




We've just finished breakfast ...but we could do with a little more toast!

Students of Pre-Nursery A explored a variety of tools and techniques in their Art and Craft lessons. They thoroughly enjoyed the learning process.





Champion: Green House, Runners up: Red House


