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Welcoming the Newcomers!



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
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

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Teachers of the Language Department, teaching the Regional and Foreign Languages in the Junior and Senior School attended a workshop – 'Meri Waali Bhasha' held online on two days - on the 15th of June and the 16th of July 2022. This workshop held by the organization, The Seeking Minds, was specially curated for CIS.

The concept and presentation of the workshop was done by Ms Debjani Sen of The Seeking Minds and the facilitators of the workshop were Mr Pranav Kumar Singh, Publisher of Ponytale Books, Mr Vishal Ganguly, mentor from Tokyo who has been the Head of Languages and Ms Askeka Tenzin, the programme leader for IB MYP Evaluation.


In the workshop, 'Meri Waali Bhasha' interactions took place on how to use teaching techniques that are useful and also fun filled to help the students to develop interest and a love for the language they learn to speak and write in. Teachers were encouraged to teach the fun way using riddles, crosswords, jokes, word games and oxymoron, puzzles, tongue twisters. Translanguaging strategies as an effective tool, and points of correlation in different languages were explained and discussed for good teaching and communication, and for ice breaking strategies.

The workshop helped the teachers to further think of ways in which a student can become proficient in listening, speaking, reading, writing and also in thinking in the language to become confident, responsible, reflective, innovative and engaged in the language he/she is studying.

Teachers of CIS were given opportunities and scope to share the common problems they faced in teaching the foreign and regional languages and were encouraged to put across their queries and questions to the experts conducting the workshop


The workshop was initiated by Mrs Sushmita Ray, the Coordinator of the Language Department of the Junior School and was well attended by teachers who found it to be very motivating, useful, interactive and refreshing.





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A comprehensive session on the Curriculum framework was conducted by Head of Department English and Curriculum Development Head Preeti Roychoudhury on 15th June in the new academic year. The attendees comprised the Principal of the Junior section Mrs Nayar, along with the entire Junior Section faculty.

The Curriculum Framework or 3CLER as we refer to it, are the guiding principles which direct and inspire the creation and execution of all learning activities in the school. They form the main principles which form the backbone of the sum total of learning experiences in the school.

The 3CLER is an acronym for Critical Thinking, Creativity, Collaboration, Effective Communication, Learner Agency and Research Management. These are mapped to the significant learning skills that are honed in every learner in our school.

The session explained the concept of a curriculum vis-à-vis the syllabus, along with each of the components of the 3CLER. The way forward emanating from the session was focused on mindfully incorporating these 6 terms of reference in all planning.



Building Positive Classroom Instructions



We started the new academic year with zeal and renewed motivation. The School Counsellor, Mrs. Spriha Patronobis, conducted an interactive session with the teachers of the Primary and Junior Section on Building Positive Classroom Instructions. The focused session on Verbal and Non-Verbal Communication and how this impacts our relationships with students, by sensitizing the pertinent age teacher body on appropriate underlying emotional needs of the young minds in their care. Additionally, the session also provided the much needed face to face interaction among teachers, the togetherness of participating in such sessions physically leading to more experiential learning.

"Classroom Management Workshop"

On June 14, The SEN department conducted a workshop with the Junior School teachers, on Classroom Management.

In this workshop, the Special Educators shared effective ways, strategies and techniques, on classroom management while including students with distinctive needs. Special Educators mainly focused on the effective classroom management for the students with SEN needs.

The topic was introduced by sharing the needs and strategies for effective classroom management with real life examples. It was followed by an activity – 'Find your classroom management style'. It was an interesting activity. Teachers were given a checklist with 12 questions to identify their classroom management style based on the answers given by them. The different types of Classroom Management styles were explained with a multisensory approach.

The workshop was concluded by discussing 5R strategies for effective classroom management.

As shared by teachers, the workshop was very engaging, relevant and practically designed. SEN dept will have a follow up sessions with the teachers to understand the effectiveness of the strategies shared during the session.



An Artist Residency Program in France

Head of Department Visual & Performing Arts, Mr. Subrata Ghosh, attended an artist residency program in France in the months of May and June 2022. He was selected and invited by an artist residency exchange program in LaRex l'Atelier in Cote d'Azur, French Riviera where he was the only Asian artist working.
