
In the month of January, Grade Upper Nursery A celebrated five VIPs.


#### Grade Upper Nursery B

In order to develop every Learner's mathematical proficiency, teachers in CIS systematically integrate the use of concrete and virtual teaching aids into classroom instruction at all grade levels. Harnessing the power of these aids has given invaluable benefits to teaching mathematics. With its aid, students are better able to visualize math concepts and gain insights into necessary fundamentals. Sharing some glimpses of math classes in CIS.

## Grade Pre Nursery

Students of Pre-Nursery participate enthusiastically, in various hands-on activities related to numbers. Various manipulatives are used to develop their mathematical skills such as to identify, count, trace, compare, sort and sequence. The association of quantities with their numerical value is being focused on.








Travelling time is the basics of everyday life. Grade 3 took the opportunity to design the future school of CIS with all the desired amenities in it. That's not all. Bigger the school, the more time taken to move from one department to another. They created a timetable with conveyance provided in school to move around. Time taken and interval when the next bus or transport service will be available to move around in school. This made them think of a plan which could be workable.

Area and Perimeter- Math collaboration with PE. Grade 3 students went down with PE teacher to measure the length and breadth of basketball court and cricket pitch. Then measured the area and perimeter to the courts. With this they bought real life situation into class and realised every piece of land is measured as per area. Land is occupied as per area and not perimeter.

- Designing their own video games based on a template, when learning positions and much more.
























Quadrilaterals whereby the creativity and thinking skills of the students came to the fore.




#### **Information and Communication Technology**

The students of Grade 2 have been working on the word processing software 'MS Word'.


They have been creative in making poster layouts for International Day of Peace and typing stories with textbox, clipart and WordArt. We integrated ICT with English in the story typing assignment.

#### Grade 4

The students also learnt how to tabulate and show information from given data using tables and bar-graphs. Students of Grade 5 took up challenging assignments in developing their application skills. They began to work with computer programming and created innovative designs with Scratch programming software. Students explored their creative skills in creating travel brochures and learnt to research for the topic.
