




Induction of new parents to the Primary Section

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
Induction of new parents to the Junior Section






Workshop by The Seeking Mind Strategies to enhance participation and learning of autistic and neurodiverse students in the Mainstream classroom


In recent years, there has been a growing recognition of the importance of raising awareness and understanding about Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD). People with ASD possess unique abilities, experiences and challenges that warrant greater societal understanding and support.

On June 24th and 29th, 2023, the SEN Department of CIS in coordination with The Seeking Mind organized online sessions on how to create an inclusive environment for people on the spectrum. Led by an experienced autism specialist, Mrs. Indrani Basu, the session aimed to provide various effective ways to enhance the participation and learning of autistic and neurodiverse students in the Mainstream classroom. 

Workshop on Integrating Social and Emotional Learning (SEL) in our classrooms and schools

Mrs Choudhary, Junior School Section Head, Mr Banerjee Middle School Section Head and Mrs Halder, School Counsellor attended a three day online workshop "Integrating Social and Emotional Learning (SEL) in our classrooms and schools" from 21st June to 23rd June 23. The workshop was conducted by Priyamvada Consulting and facilitated by Mrs Suchitra Sarda.

Throughout the workshop, each session began with check-ins and provided moments for mindful pauses and resetting, fostering a conducive learning environment. Each session concluded with reflections and an optimistic closure, promoting a sense of growth and positivity.

The introductory session delved into the definition of social-emotional learning, explored the CASEL framework, examined theories that inform SEL practices, and identified tangible indicators of SEL implementation. The second session focussed on practical strategies for integrating SEL practices within classrooms and lessons, empowering teachers to create a nurturing and supportive learning environment. Additionally, participants explored the theories underlying implementation science, including the key components and factors necessary for systemic implementation of SEL in schools. It was an enriching workshop.

It gave the participating teachers an opportunity to develop an understanding of SEL, practical tools for implementation and the ability to make meaningful connections between SEL and their personal and professional lives.
