Body Safety and Awareness sessions with Primary Students

In the month of January, the school counsellors- Ms Sukonna Halder, Ms Farishta Dastur Mukerji and Ms Spriha Patronobis conducted sessions with the students of the Primary section on 'Body Safety and Awareness'.

The sessions focused on making the students aware of the differences between a SafeTouch (a touch that feels comfortable and safe) and Unsafe Touch (a touch that feels uncomfortable). The interactive and activity based sessions helped the students understand the different body parts that are sensitive to touch and identify situations and occurrences of appropriate and inappropriate touch, thus making them aware of the importance of consent. The sessions also helped the students to learn and equip themselves with strategies on how they can protect themselves in case they experience situations that put them at risk.

Health Awareness Talk on Paediatric Neurology

Neurodevelopment Awareness Talk - A Workshop by Dr. Jigyasa Sinha in collaboration with the SEN Department, Calcutta International School

In an endeavour to promote a deeper understanding of early childhood neurodevelopment and to empower parents with valuable insights, the Special Education Needs (SEN) department of Calcutta International School organized a workshop in collaboration with Narayana R. N. Tagore hospital. The session was conducted on 19.1.24, by Dr. Jigyasa Sinha, a distinguished paediatric neurologist. The workshop aimed to sensitize parents of toddlers to the intricacies of early brain development and the crucial role it plays in shaping a child's future. Dr. Sinha, renowned for her expertise in paediatric neurology, engaged the audience with her knowledge and practical advice.

The event commenced with an enlightening overview of typical neurodevelopmental milestones in children. Dr. Sinha emphasized the importance of early identification and intervention for children with special needs, underlining the notion that every child is unique and may follow their own developmental trajectory. She also enlightened the audience about different neurodevelopmental conditions and their red flags. One of the highlights of the workshop was the interactive session where parents had the opportunity to ask questions and share their concerns. Dr. Sinha addressed queries related to speech and language development, motor skills, and social-emotional growth, providing tailored guidance to each participant. The workshop also shed light on the red flags that parents should be aware of and the significance of early intervention programs. Dr. Sinha underscored the importance of creating a supportive and inclusive environment at home and school to nurture the overall development of children with diverse needs.

Calcutta International School's SEN department demonstrated its commitment to foster a collaborative and informed community by organizing this insightful workshop. Parents left the session equipped with a deeper understanding of their child's neurodevelopment, armed with practical strategies to support their toddlers on their unique journeys.

Sen Workshop

Scaffolding

The Special Educational Needs (SEN) team at Calcutta International School organized an insightful workshop on 8th of January for the Junior Section's mainstream teachers to promote inclusive education. The workshop centered on exploring the pedagogical concept of "scaffolding," which aims to provide support within the mainstream classroom for students with diverse abilities.

In the session, the teachers were introduced to the principles of scaffolding, a teaching strategy that involves providing temporary support to help students reach a higher level of understanding and skill acquisition. The metaphorical scaffold acts as a bridge, enabling students to gradually gain independence and achieve academic success.

The workshop emphasized practical techniques for implementing scaffolding strategies effectively. SEN teachers shared real-life examples and case studies, illustrating how scaffolding can be tailored to individual students' needs. The goal was to equip mainstream teachers with the tools to identify learning gaps and create a supportive environment that fosters student growth.

Participants were introduced to a variety of scaffolding techniques, such as breaking down complex tasks into manageable steps, providing visual aids, using questioning strategies to guide thinking, and offering additional resources when necessary. The workshop encouraged a proactive approach, involving the participants to develop a scaffolded worksheet at the end of the session.


This proved to be a very successful initiative as teachers went out of the Library refreshed and "well read"!


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
