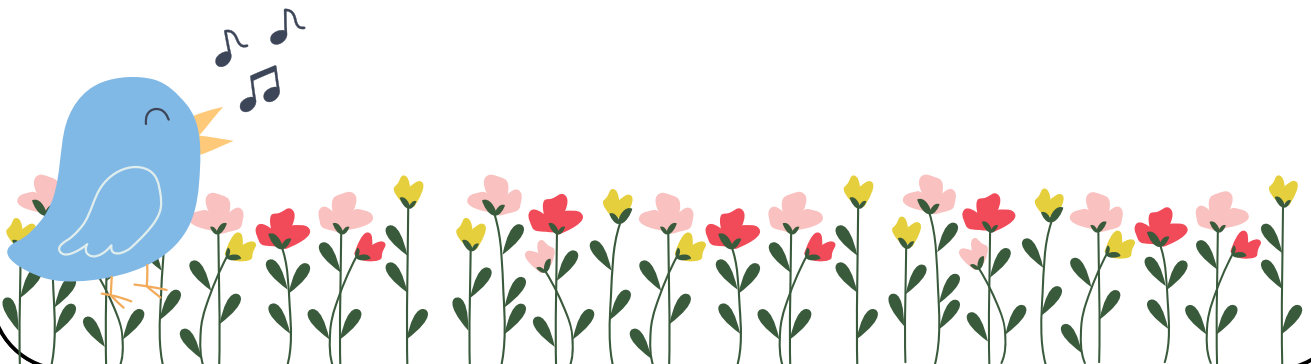

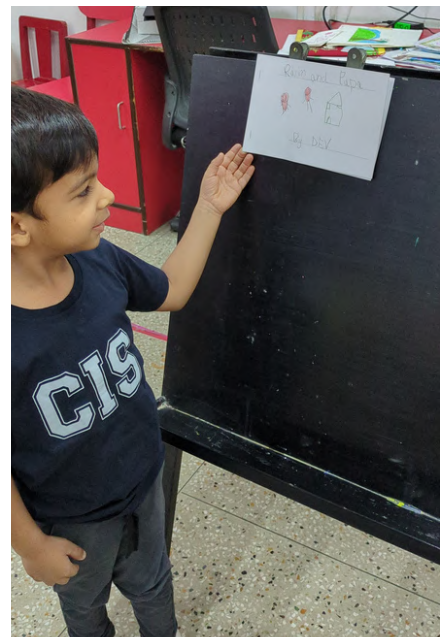
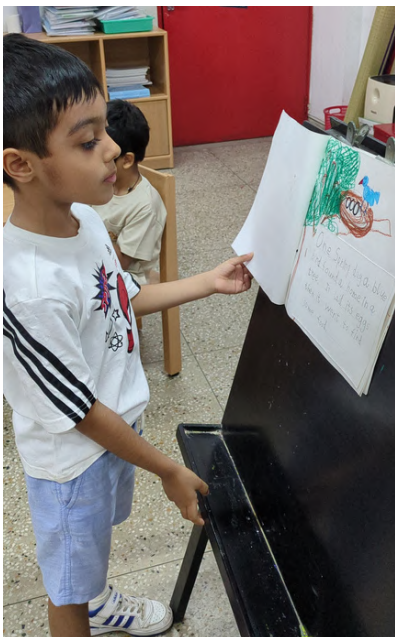


## Theme of Spring during Author week

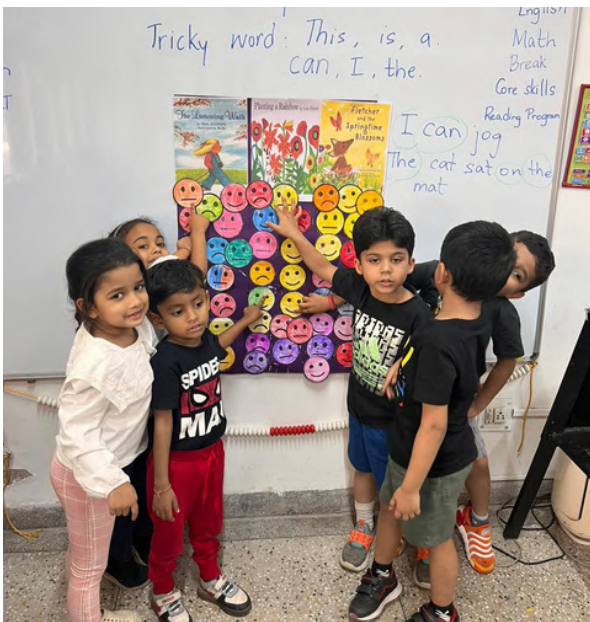




# Exploring stories

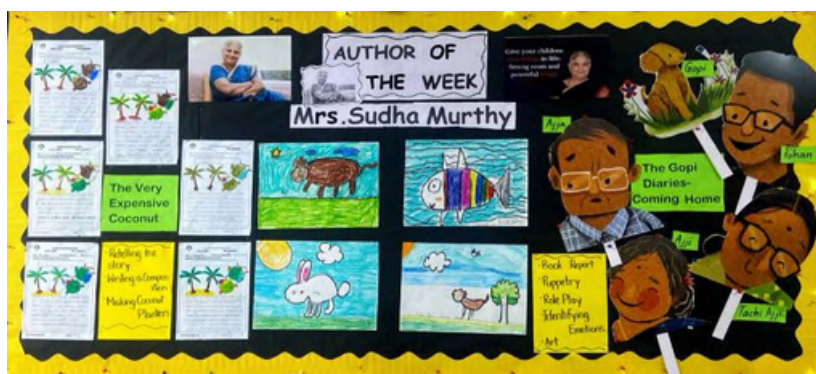
This event was invaluable for fostering a love for reading and creativity among our young students.

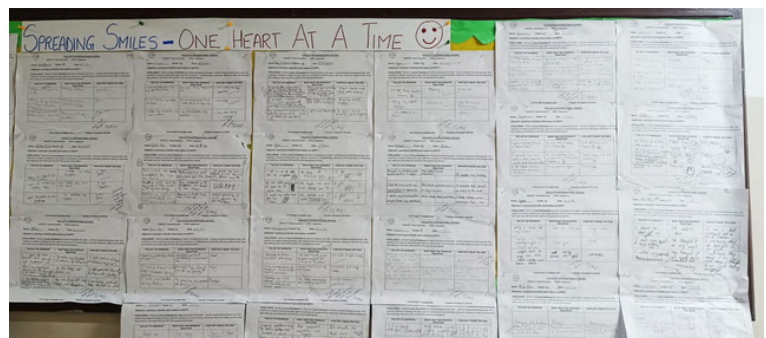

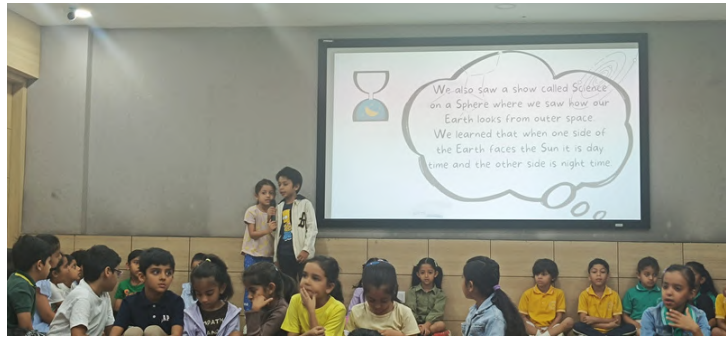

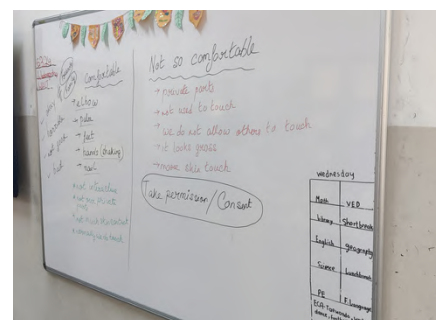


# Student Development

## Learning to respect boundaries....

"Students of grades 3-5 attended a series of awareness sessions with Swayam, a leading organization in the city, which is well known for its accomplishments in the field of social justice and equity. The sessions were carefully curated to create an in-depth understanding of Consent. Through group activities based on experiential learning, students noticed how lack of consent in our daily social interaction, can lead to discomfort, disrespect, and inappropriateness. Since this was a safe space, students were also able to express their feelings regarding various aspects of their school - what they value, challenges they face, how they cope with these challenges and so on. The sessions with Swayam are ongoing.

## Session on Cyber security

A three member team from the Cybercrime Department of Kolkata Police, SI Mr. Kuntal Sidhhartha, SI Mr. Raja Saha and Lady Constable Ms. Suraiya Sultan visited our school on 8th March 2024, to conduct an awareness session for students of Grades 3, 4 and 5. The session began with highlighting the myriad online risks that young children and adolescents face, sharing real life case studies and the legal consequences of the same. This was followed by some useful strategies that one can adopt to ensure digital safety on their cell phones/ tablets/laptops and PCs. The students were very enthusiastic and had many questions to ask about hacking, befriending others on gaming sites, money laundering, clicking on unknown links, AI generated image and voice morphing, catfishing/impersonating to name a few. The police officials emphasized that no child below the age of 13 years should have a Facebook or Instagram account - this is as per the norms of META, however many children tend to violate the same. The officials also reminded the children that despite being minors, engaging in illegal or wrongful online activities could lead to consequences under the Juvenile Justice Act, with appropriate actions taken accordingly. The session ended with some questions from the teachers on how to enforce greater online safety and gadget privacy, especially related to monetary scams. We at CIS are thankful to Kolkata Police, Cybercrime Dept, for the informative and enlightening session and hope to have more meaningful sessions with them in the times to come.

# Grade 5- Lego Robotics, AI & ML workshop

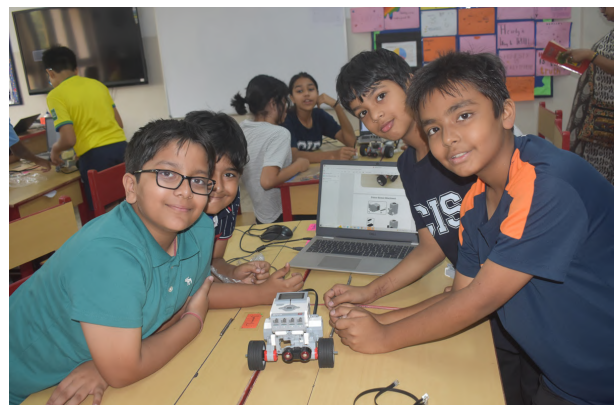

Artificial Intelligence (AI) and Machine Learning (ML) have become integral parts of today's world, influencing various aspects of our lives and driving innovation across industries. AI and machine learning are rapidly growing fields with a high demand for skilled professionals. It has the potential to revolutionize how we approach and solve complex problems. Students who understand these technologies can contribute to innovation in diverse areas such as medicine, engineering, education, entertainment to name a few.

Recognising the growing importance of AI, Calcutta International school organised a 2 day workshop in association with Edutech on 13th and 14th March, 2024.

On Day 1 of the workshop Students were exposed to Lego Robotics. They assembled the drive base robot with a sensor. This was followed by programming the driving base to make precise and controlled movements and finally use the Ultrasonic Sensor to detect the obstacle and react to it.

On Day 2 of the workshop Grade 5 learners were introduced to AI and ML. Students created a hands-on project on the ML platform and then integrated it with LEGO Robotics using the range of ultrasonic sensors so that the robot was able to make different decisions based on the instructions given in the Project on Search & Rescue Robot.







The two-day workshop concluded with a showcase where students demonstrated their robotic creations and shared their learnings about AI and ML concepts.

The event received positive feedback from both students and parents, highlighting the value of such educational initiatives.





# Humanities Field Trip to ICSP

In the spirit of fostering a holistic educational approach, it is with enthusiasm that we introduce a humanities-based field trip to our eager learners. ## Taekwondo

Taekwondo, also known as World Taekwondo, has a comprehensive syllabus for belt grading assessment. The Korean terms - POOMSAE/TAEGEUK are a dynamic series of offense and defense actions, requiring attention to body movement, eyes, and breathing. It is a direct expression of mental and physical refinement, embodying the principles of Taekwondo spirits and techniques.



Different Poomsae exam represent different belt levels- Poomsae 1 for yellow belt, Poomsae 2 and 3 for green belt, Poomsae 4 and 5 for blue belt, Poomsae 6 and 7 for red belt, and Poomsae 8 for black belt 1st DAN. We are pleased to share that our Junior School students have successfully passed the belt assessments for yellow and green belts and received certificates from the Bengal Traditional Taekwondo Association.





# Vocals

The Junior School Vocal ECA Assembly held on 1st March was a delightful and memorable musical morning. # Robotics

The students of grades 3-5 Robotics ECA, in collaboration with Kidotronics, hosted their annual end-of-year exhibit on 1st March 2024.

The event was a showcase of the innovative projects that the students had been working on throughout the year. Class 3 students presented a range of projects, including a Plants and Pollinators model with a bee, a hungry alligator, and a new generation home with a Spy robot for security. Additionally, a Goal Keeper & Kicker set provided visitors with the opportunity to score goals in an electrified atmosphere. An all-girls team also captured everyone's attention with their carnival carousel featuring a speed controller joystick.

Meanwhile, students from Class 4 & 5 exhibited robots equipped with ultrasonic and touch sensors. Industrial robots such as the Scissor lift, Conveyor Belt, and Porter were displayed, along with other creations like a robotic Gymnast, a Venus Fly Trap, and a fast power car capable of detecting obstacles.



Visitors, including parents, teachers, and fellow students, were impressed by the students' projects and thoroughly enjoyed trying them out. The exhibit was a testament to the students' hard work and creativity throughout the year.



# Awards and Accolades

## E-waste

At Calcutta International School, a comprehensive initiative was taken up for tackling the issue of electronic waste (e-waste) . Acknowledging the environmental consequences of improperly discarded electronic devices, the school, with backing from the Science Department, initiated a program focused on responsibly handling electronic waste. This initiative included the installation of an EWaste Bin at the outset of the academic year 2024-2025, in collaboration with Hulladek. It evolved into a student-led initiative managed by members of the Junior School Council, a team of volunteer students from the senior section, with the backing of the Social Service Head and Deputy Head, under the supervision of their teachers.

Students and staff were encouraged to bring in their old or unused electronic devices, such as computers, phones, and tablets. Our young,enthusiastic volunteers conducted a collection drive - on a weekly basis for the Junior School and on monthly basis for the Senior School that was done regularly with great enthusiasm.





We are delighted to announce that CIS received the "Green Enthusiast" award at the Green Architects Expo 2024, hosted at Dhono Dhanno Auditorium, Alipore, on March 15th (Friday), signifying the commencement of a significant journey.

The E-Waste was weighed and collected by Hulladek, and when the bin overflowed, it was carried to their disposal centres for recycling. A total of 300 kg E-Waste was collected throughout the academic session, 2023-24

Additionally, an awareness campaign was conducted for our young learners to highlight the importance of e-waste management and the benefits of recycling electronics. Through promoting environmental responsibility and tackling e-waste, we're not just aiding a cleaner environment but also instilling lifelong sustainability values in our youth and community.

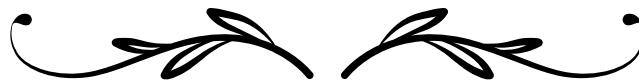
