A special mention must be made of the students of Grade 11 who oversaw the logistics of the event and Grade 12 students who concluded the event by coming in with the school logo.







The Calcutta International School community is proud of these students' accomplishments and wishes
















IB History students attend session by Anti-Apartheid activist, Ms.Marjorie Brown

Mesmerises Kolkata



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













And as they bid farewell to Skandagiri, they carried with them not just memories, but lessons that would last a lifetime.




6 films shortlisted in the Junior category (up to and including Class VIII) and 10 films shortlisted in the Senior category, Class IX and above.


Collaboration between India Heritage And Humanities Department (History):


History students of Grades 11 (A Levels and IBDP) Auroni Sarkar, Ruhani Duttagupta, Rena Tara Phookan, Aditya Sanghi and Evangeli Saha, participated in a series of sessions and a Heritage Walk after which they submitted essays as part of the collaboration. India Heritage offered the students valuable insights into the history of Kolkata. Online sessions conducted by Dr. Sukanya Mitra began the first part of the course, which very coherently charted the origin of the city and dealt with various nuances of the colonial age. For the second part, students participated in an enriching Heritage Walk conducted by Mrs. Navpreet Arora, which provided them with a valuable experience of the different historical sites of Kolkata. The Walk took students to the General Post Office, Writers Building, Currency Building, and St. John's Church among other important sites. For the final session, students submitted essays based on their sessions with Dr. Mitra and their takeaways from the Walk. After submission, they also received certificates from India Heritage Awards Scheme.











Chemistry

The primary goal of this project was to create informative posters using newspaper articles to raise awareness about various waterborne diseases. By highlighting real-life incidents, the students aimed to educate the community on the importance of water hygiene and promote preventive measures.

The children Identified and research prevalent water-borne diseases such as cholera, typhoid, dysentery, etc. and gathered statistics and real-life incidents related to these diseases.




Physics made Fun!

Grade 8B

The chapter 'Heat transfer' was revised using a board game as an activity conducted by Mrs Tania Ghosh with Grade 8B students. Students were given clues and were asked to play by the rules of the game and retelling the various specifics of certain heat transfer processes, aided in auditory learning.









Grade 9B

Grade 9B students were taught the concept of Centre of Mass and Stability through the process of 'learning by doing' initiated by Mrs Tania Ghosh. Students tried to create as many stable structures as possible using uniform wooden cubes. They learned how the centre of mass has to be aligned to the structure as a whole to make it stable while some fundamentals of architecture were also discussed.







Peer Teaching conducted between A2 Physics and IBDP Year-I Biology Students













In the ever-evolving landscape of scientific inquiry, the intersection of physics and biology has become a fertile ground for innovation and discovery. One such collaborative venture has emerged through the joint efforts of students of Physics of A2 and students of Biology of IBDP Year I, who explored the realms of colorimetry and photo spectrometry, an area that lies at the crossroads of their respective disciplines. Photo spectrometry, the study of interactions between light and matter, finds applications across physics

and biology, from understanding the electronic structure of molecules to unraveling the intricacies of photosynthesis. Colorimetry, the science of measuring and describing colors, is a field that seamlessly connects physics and biology. This interdisciplinary collaboration is particularly evident in the study of color perception and the underlying physiological and physical mechanisms that govern it.

The physics students of A2 conducted a lesson for IB1 Biology students to explain the connection between Physics and Biology in the realms of Photospectrometry, the study of interactions between light and matter and Colorimetry, the science of measuring and describing colors, The physics students brought their knowledge of the electromagnetic spectrum, optics, and the principles of spectroscopy to the table. They contributed to the understanding of sophisticated instruments, such as colorimeters, spectrometers and photodetectors, ensuring precision and accuracy in capturing spectral data. Their insights into the physics of light-matter interactions lay foundation for experimental design for the Biology students. Live demonstration of the colorimeter was shown during the lesson.
